COMPLAINT

Plaintiff, Eric Cable, complains against the State of New Hampshire, for the reasons set forth below:

- 1. Plaintiff, ERIC CABLE, at all times relevant was a prisoner at the New Hampshire State Prison for Men.
- 2. At all times relevant, the defendant STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, through its Department of Corrections, was responsible for housing and caring for inmates at the prison.

FACTS

3. ERIC CABLE was incarcerated at the New Hampshire State Prison for Men on February 13, 2014. Routine lab studies done on March 5, 2014, showed an elevated serum glucose level. Fingerstick glucose checks were ordered for three days but were not done.

- 4. On June 8, 2015, he was diagnosed with Type II diabetes after complaining of being excessively thirsty, urinating a lot, and abdominal pain. His blood sugar at that time was 466 (normal 65-99). He was started on the diabetes medication, Metformin. A second medication, Glipizide, was added on August 6, 2015.
- 5. Although Mr. Cable was being seen in the Chronic Care Clinic, medical management of his diabetes fell below the standard of care.
- 6. Lab tests were sporadic even though they had been ordered. An A1C should be done every three months. The only ones done were on September 24, 2015, and January 27, 2016, (both results were 8, ideal for a diabetic is less than 7). No microalbumin has been done, which should be done yearly. There is no baseline TSH. There are no foot exams with monofilament testing (should be done with each visit). An eye exam was done on July 16, 2015, but it was not a dilated exam for diabetic retinopathy which should be done yearly. No aspirin or ACE inhibitor has been prescribed which are also standards.
- 7. Uncontrolled diabetes can lead to damage of other body organs, especially the eyes, heart, kidneys, and nerves. The key to preventing these complications is good glycemic control. Mr. Cable is not being properly managed to achieve good glycemic control.

CAUSE OF ACTION MEDICAL NEGLIGENCE

- 8. Plaintiff realleges every allegation contained in paragraphs 1 through 7.
- 9. Defendant, STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, through its agents and employees, had a duty to plaintiff, ERIC CABLE, to provide him with reasonable and proper medical care in accordance with the applicable standard of care.
 - 10. The conduct described above was a violation of that duty.
- 11. As a direct and proximate result of defendant's carelessness, negligence, and improper care, plaintiff, ERIC CABLE, suffered permanent injury, great pain and suffering, mental anguish, loss of enjoyment of life, and other losses.
- 12. By certified mail, return receipt requested, pursuant to R.S.A. 541-B:14, the plaintiff gave notice of this claim to the defendant, STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.
 - 13. Plaintiff demands a jury by trial.
