Elk, also called wapiti, are members of the deer family, second in size only to the moose. Elk are found in the woods and grasslands of the western U.S. and Canada. With the eradication of their primary predator, wolves, from the Yellowstone ecosystem, the elk population skyrocketed. Since wolves were introduced in 1995, the population has stabilized, willow forests have also returned--as have the songbirds and beavers that make their homes among the trees.

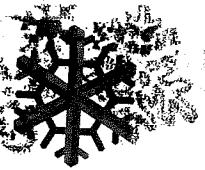

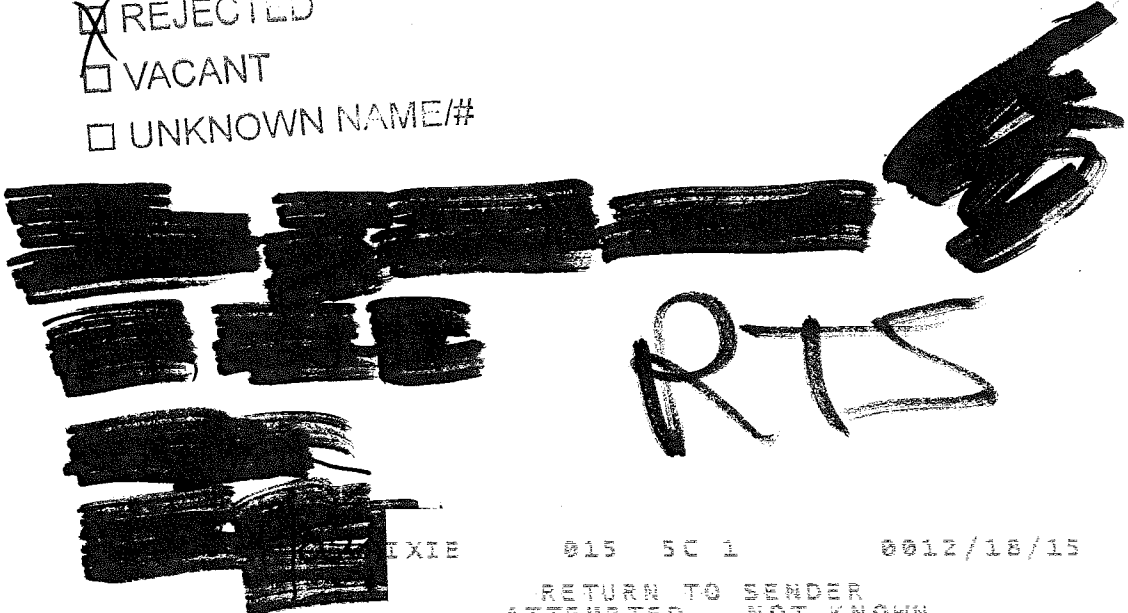
